

# SUPPORTING LIDS 4 KIDZ AND CONTAINERS 4 CHANGE AND RECYCLING AT THE SAME TIME.

Forestview Educators with and alongside the children have recently been engaged in many recycling conversations and discussed supporting this wonderful organisation so that we can continue to honour our philosophical commitment to encouraging all children to be Active Citizens.

This week we introduced the children to our Lids 4 Kidz storage container and talked about how this program not only benefits our environment as we are collecting plastic lids for recycling (and not sending to landfill) but that these are being used to make body parts (e.g. hands, feet) for children who may have had an accident to these parts of their body or may need this as a physical aid to help them engage with the world like we do. We believe, children are active participants and citizens of local and global communities. Children have ideas, understandings, experiences and actions to contribute towards creating an inclusive, just, peaceful and ecologically sustainable society.

Supporting Lids 4 Kidz will be another proactive step we can take to support our ACTIVE CITIZEN commitment. We are so excited to post our lids from our lunch box items in here and probably will hassle you at home about saving this lids to bring to kindy to post in the Lids 4 Kidz box.





In addition we headed out to the front of kindy to discover another important collection bin.....The big red bin that will be used to collect other recyclable items such as plastic bottles, popper or cardboard drinking cartons and metal cans (softdrink cans) - no glass please.

Mrs Louise talked about that there are other items in our world that we use that can be recycled into new products and that these will have a recycle symbol on them and that some of them have the number 10c as well. This means that if we recycle these containers we (and you place them in the Kindy bin) we will get 10c for each container to go towards upgrading resources at Kindy. So not only are we helping the environment by reducing the amount of waste we send to landfill we are helping Kindy out too.

## Forestview Kindy has teamed up with ABC Recycling!

### How it works:

It's easy as 1,2,3...



1. Collect eligible containers
2. Place in provided bin out the front of Kindy
3. Earn a refund which is donated back to Kindy

### To do:

- Containers should be empty
- Preferably rinsed
- Remove all lids
- No rubbish inside containers

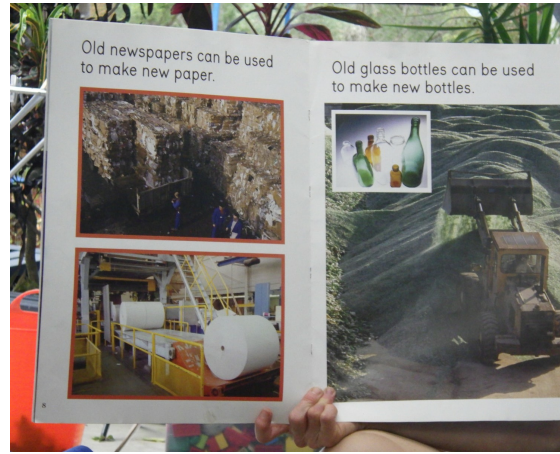

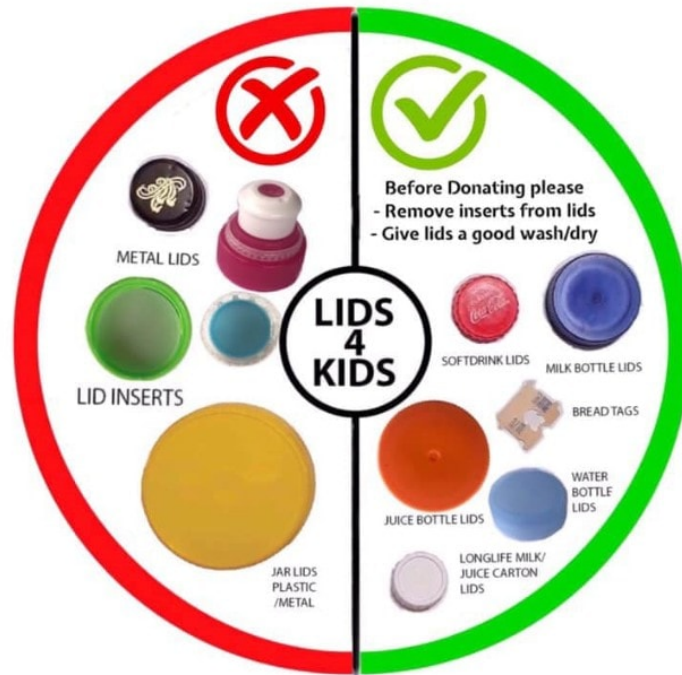

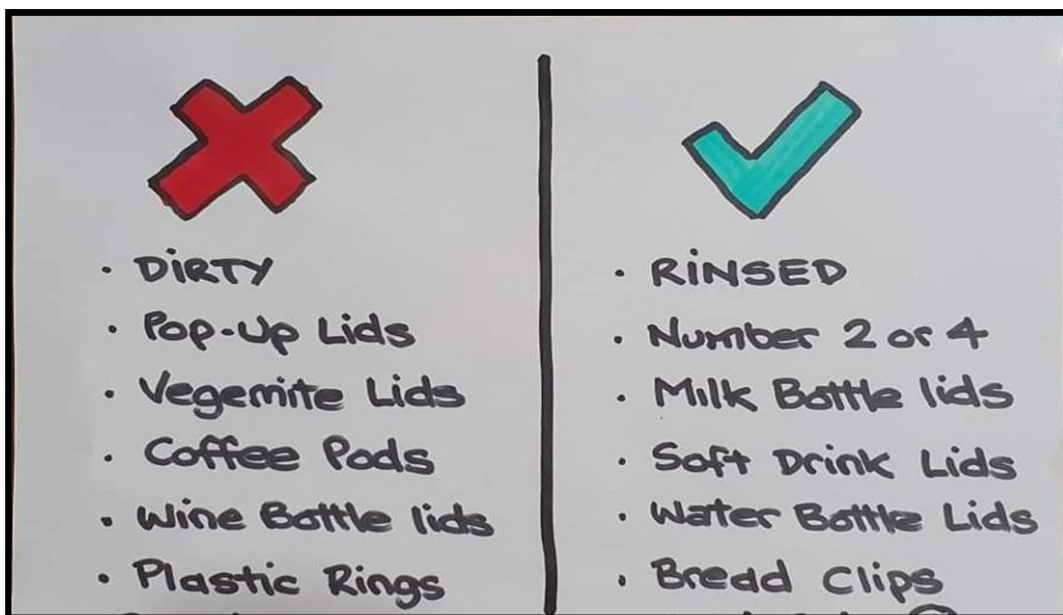
