She asked us if we would like to hear the story. Naturally we were very keen on this idea and were curious to find out if he ate the same food in Japan and wondered how he might have got there.

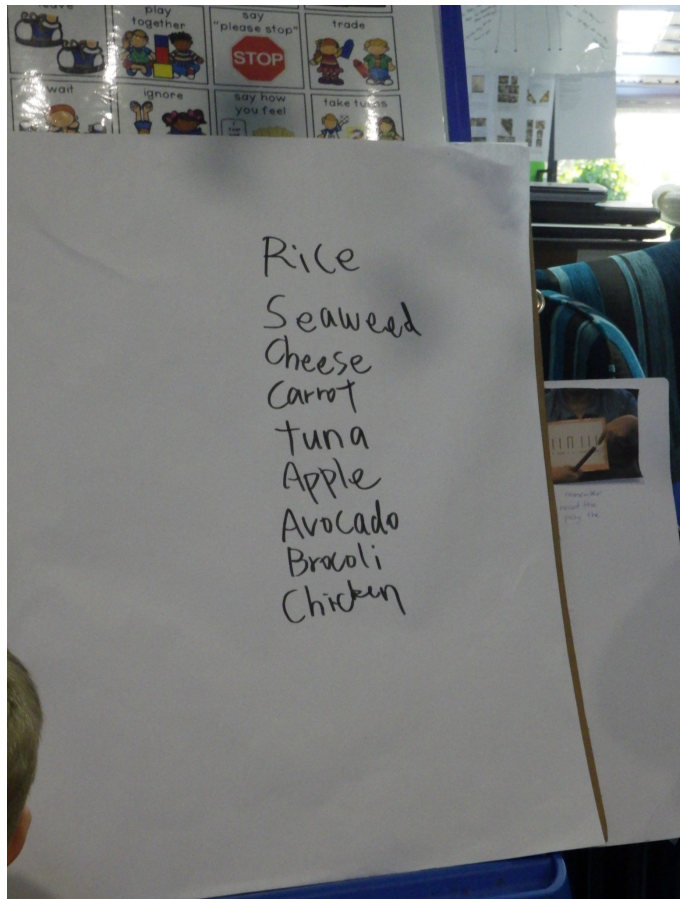
We thought he might have taken a plane, a boat, a hot air balloon, he might have swum the whole way, a hovercraft, an underwater car or even a submarine.

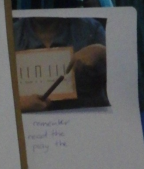

Now he wasn't hungry any more and he wasn't a tiny caterpillar any more. He was a BIG caterpillar.

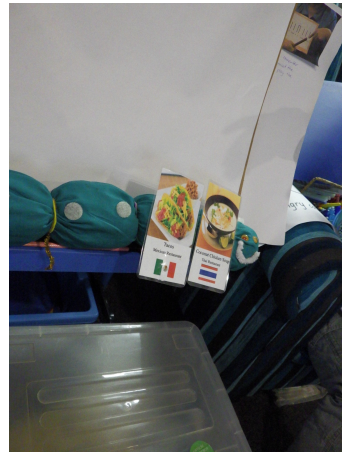
